The proposal was approved by the shareholders at the Extraordinary General Meeting held on the 26th February, 2025. The Company took the following steps as a prelude to the proposed Initial Public Offer.

Conversion as a Public Company

The Company converted itself into a Public Company with effect from the 23rd December, 2024 and the Memorandum and Articles of Association were amended accordingly.

Share Capital

For meeting its immediate requirements, the Board of Directors, approved the raising of funds in the form of equity by way of making a private placement offer, subject to the approval of the shareholders of the Company in a General Meeting. The proposal involved the issuance of up to 1,61,000 (Rupees One Lakh Sixty One Thousand Only) fully paid up equity shares having the face value of ₹10 (Rupees Ten Only) each for cash at an issue price of ₹702 (Rupees Seven Hundred and Two Only) per Subscription Share including a premium of ₹ 692 (Rupees Six Hundred and Ninety Two Only) per Subscription Share (based on the Valuation Report obtained by the Company), amounting to ₹11,30,22,000 (Rupees Eleven Crores Thirty Lakhs Twenty Two Thousand Only) to certain selected subscribers belonging to the Non-Promoter Category. At the Extraordinary General Meeting held on the 2nd September, 2024, the consent of the shareholders for the private placement offer was obtained. It is observed that during the Audit Period, the Company had taken unsecured loans which was not in compliance with the provisions of Sections 73 of the Companies Act, 2013. However, all such loans have since been fully repaid.

The Company made a fresh investment during the Audit Period in compliance with the provisions of the Act and did not give any loan or provide any guarantee. The Company was not required to close its Register of Members during the Audit Period. The Company has not declared any dividend since its incorporation and hence the question of transferring the unpaid/unclaimed dividends to the Investor Education and Protection Fund does not arise.

I further report that the Board of Directors of the Company is duly constituted with proper balance of Executive, Non-Executive and Independent Directors. There has been changes in the composition of the Board of Directors/Key Managerial Personnel during the Audit Period. During the year under review, considering the proposed initial public offer of the Equity Shares of the Company, three (3) Independent Directors and a woman Director were appointed on the Board. The existing Wholetime Directors, Mr.S,Seshadri and Mr.R.Sekar were reappointed under the provisions of Section 196 and 197 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with the Schedule V to the Act, for a period of 3 years, with effect from the 10th February, 2025, following the conversion of the Company into a Public Company.

As regards the Key Managerial Personnel, Mr.Balaji Srinivasan was appointed as the Company Secretary cum Compliance Officer with effect from the 16th December, 2024. However, he chose to resign owing to certain personal reasons and his resignation was accepted with effect from the 11th July, 2025 and on the same date, Mr.Laxmikanth Tangudu was appointed as the Company Secretary cum Compliance Officer of the Company.

Ms.Sujatha, the General Manager (Commercial) of the Company, was appointed as the Chief Financial Officer (CFO) of the Company with effect from the 20th December, 2024. Subsequently, she was elevated to the Board and became a Wholetime Director cum CFO, with effect from the 10th February, 2025.

3. While scheduling the Board Meetings, adequate notice was given to all the Directors and whenever the Meetings were held at short notice, the consent of all the Directors had been obtained and so recorded in the respective minutes themselves; the agenda and detailed notes on agenda were sent in advance except in the case of those meetings which had to be held at short notice and a system exists for seeking and obtaining further information and clarifications on the agenda items before the meetings and for meaningful participation at the meeting; All the decisions at the Board and Committee meetings were taken unanimously;

During the Audit Period, there was no prosecution initiated and no fines or penalties were imposed during the year under review, under the Act, SCRA, Depositories Act

and the Rules, Regulations and Guidelines framed under these Acts against/on the Company, its Directors and Officers.

The Directors have complied with the disclosure requirements in respect of their eligibility of appointment;

 - ili. For formulating an ESOP Scheme of the Company in alignment with the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Share Based Employee Benefits and Sweat Equity) Regulations, 2021.
 - iv. For increasing the limits under Section 180(1)(a) and 180(1)(c) of the Act.
 - v. For issuing Bonus Shares, by capitalising a sum of Rs.11,59,25,600 out of the Company's free reserves, as per the audited accounts of the Company for the financial year ended March 31, 2024, in the ratio of 10 (ten) Bonus Equity Shares for every 1 (one) Equity Share of the Company held as on the 17th December, 2024, being the record date



- fixed for the purpose. The Bonus Shares were allotted at the Board Meeting held on the 20th December, 2024.
- vi. For amending the Objects Clause suitably to reflect the range of activities of the Company,
- vii. For the approval of the Initial Public Offering (IPO) of Equity Shares of the Company up to 55,00,000 Equity Shares which shall include a fresh issue of Equity Shares, at a price to be determined by the Company in consultation with the Book Running Lead Manager.

Subsequently, After the closure of the financial year, the Company had filed the draft red herring prospectus with the Natonal Stock Exchange Ltd., (NSE),, on the 11th April, 2025. After responding to all the queries raised by the NSE, the In-Principle approval was received by the Company vide NSE's letter dated 29th July, 2025.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion:

We have audited the financial statements of Sattva Engineering Construction Limited, (CIN: U45201TN2005PLC058383) ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March 2025, and the statement of Profit and Loss, Statement of Changes in Equity and Statement of Cash Flows for the period from 1st April 2024 to 31st March 2025, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information. In our opinion, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31st March 2025, profit, changes in equity and cash flows for the period from 1st April 2024 to 31st March 2025.

Basis for Opinion:

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view.

Key Audit Matters

Recognition of Contract Revenue, Work In Progress, and Contract Costs:

All contracts of the company are fixed price contracts. Revenue for the reporting period comprises of actual work done, certified and billed plus the actual work done and uncertified (Work in Progress) at the accepted contract price. WIP is measured based on percentage completion method, the proportion being the actual cost incurred till the reporting period to the total cost incurred / to be incurred to complete the contract. The unbilled work in progress for the period ended 31st March 2025 amounts to Rs. 33,16,11,827.30/-. The recognition of contract revenue and the resultant profit/ loss therefore rely on estimates in relation to the computation of Work In Progress. In doing so, the management is required to exercise judgement in its assessment of the costs to complete the projects. The company

primarily arises from construction contracts and hence the changes in these estimates can result in material adjustments to revenue. Considering this element of uncertainty, this area has been considered a key audit matter for the current period of audit.

The audit procedures performed by us to address this key audit matter included, but were not limited to the following:

- Evaluated the design and tested the operating effectiveness of key internal financial controls
 including those related to estimation of forecasted contract revenue and contracts costs;
- For cost incurred to date, tested samples by verifying underlying supporting documents
- Evaluated the appropriateness and adequacy of the disclosures related to contract revenue and costs in the financial statements in accordance with the applicable accounting standards.

Notes relating to recoverability of current trade receivables and non-current trade receivables:

Trade receivables for the period ended 31st March 2025 are **Rs 32,35,36,276.00** and retention money amounting to **Rs 16,31,08,537.7** respectively are based on bills raised which are certified and accepted by customers. And hence the company management has determined that no provision is required to be recognised for the aforementioned receivables. The Balance of Trade Receivables & Retention money includes an amount of **Rs.2,37,28,953/-** and **Rs.72,63,401/-** due from **M/s BGR Energy Systems Limited** against whom the company has approached NCLT and filed petition for winding up in order to recover the dues. The ageing of trade receivables for BGR outstanding: >3years = Rs 1,97,25,565 /-; & 1 - 2 years = Rs 40,03,388/-.

Considering the materiality of the amounts involved, and significance of management judgement involved in assessing the recoverability, this was considered to be a key audit matter in the audit of the financial statements.

The audit procedures performed by us to address this key audit matter included, but were not limited to the following:

- Obtained an understanding of the management process and evaluated the design and tested the effectiveness of key internal financial controls for assessing the recoverability of unbilled work-in-progress (contract assets) and trade receivables
- Assessed the reasonability of judgments exercised and estimates made by management with respect to the recoverability of these receivables and validated them with corroborating evidence;
- Verified contractual arrangements to support management's position on the tenability and recoverability of these receivables;
- Evaluated the appropriateness and adequacy of the disclosures in the financial statements in accordance with the applicable accounting standards.



Responsibility of Management for Financial Statements

Sattva Engineering Construction Limited (earlier known as Sattva Engineering Construction Private Limited) is a Company limited by shares domiciled in India and incorporated under the provisions of the Companies Act, 1956. The Company is engaged in the business of providing water resource management solutions which includes the Water Supply Scheme with underground and overhead tank, Under Ground Sewerage System, Sewage Treatment Plants and Water Treatment Plants

The name of Company was changed from "Sattva Engineering Construction Private Limited" to "Sattva Engineering Construction Limited" consequent to conversion of our Company from private limited company to public limited company with effect from December 23, 2024.

Significant Accounting Policies

1. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

Accounting Convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historic cost convention, in accordance with the applicable accounting standards. The preparation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognised in the period in which the results are known/

h. Property, plant and Equipment

Property, Plant and Equipments are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and provisions and reversals on account of impairment. Cost is inclusive of freight, levies taxes and also any costs directly attributable to bringing the assets to their working condition for intended use. Project Expenses incurred which are identifiable to particular assets are accumulated with the original cost of such assets. Common Project expenses are allocated to resulting fixed assets of that project in the same

Depreciation is charged based on the useful lives of assets laid down in Schedule II of the Companies Act 2013 for all assets put to use on or after 1/4/2014, after retaining a residual value of 5% of the original cost of the assets. The Balance written down values of assets existing as on 31/3/2014 have been depreciated based on the balance useful lives determined as per schedule II, with respect to the dates on which those assets have been originally put to use, after retaining a residual value of 5% of the original cost of the assets. No depreciation is charged in the year of sale of any asset. Depreciation related to Asset Less than 5000 to be written off in the year of purchase

2. Revenue Recognition

- a) Revenue is recognized and expenses are accounted on their accrual with necessary provisions for all known liabilities and losses. Revenue is recognized only when it can be reliably measured and it is reasonable to expect ultimate collection. Interest income is recognized on time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and rate applicable. Other non operating income is recognized when the un-conditional right to receive such income is vested in the Company.
- b) Contract revenue is recognised by adding the aggregate cost and proportionate margin using the percentage completion method. Percentage of completion is determined as a proportion of cost incurred-to-date to the total estimated contract cost. Full provision is made for any loss in the period in which it is foreseen.

3. Inventories

Inventories are valued as follows:

Raw materials, components, construction materials, stores, spares and loose tools at lower of cost or net realisable value.

Work-in-progress on construction contracts at cost till such time the outcome of the job cannot be ascertained reliably and at realisable value thereafter

4. Trade Receviables and Other Current Assets

Trade Receivables are shown to the extent of outstanding on the bills raised by the company. Retention money on contracts, which are not due for payment, is classified under the head Other Current Assets. Those retention money which are due for payment is transferred to Sundry Debtors.

5. Trade Payables and Other Current Liabilities

Trade payables are recognized based on the outstanding amounts on bills issued by vendors. Retention money on Sub contractors that are not yet due for payment is classified under 'Other Current Liabilities.' Those retention money which are due for payment is transferred to Sundry Creditors.

6. Provisions, Contingent liabilities and Contingent Assets

All known liabilities of material nature have been provided for in the accounts except liabilities of a contingent nature which have been disclosed at their estimated value in the notes on accounts in accordance with Accounting Standard- 29. Contingent Assets are not recognized or measured. As regards Provisions, only those obligations arising from past events existing independently of an enterprise's future actions are recognized as provisions.

7. Provision for Chirent Tax & Deferred Tax

2)Deferred tax is recognized for all timing differences between taxable and accounting income using the tax rates and laws that are enacted or substantially enacted as on date of reporting. Deferred tax assets are recognized only when there is virtual certainty of such assets materializing in the near future.

8. Earnings per share:

Basic earnings per share is calculated by dividing the net profit/(loss) for the period attributable to the equity shareholders by the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the year.

9. Retirement Benefits:

The company has a defined contribution plan in the form of a Provident Fund scheme for its staff and pension scheme under the employee's pension scheme 1995 for all its employees, which is administered by the Provident Fund commissioner. The above mentioned schemes are classified as defined contribution plan as the company has no further obligation beyond making the contributions. The company's contributions to the defined contribution plans are charged to the profit and loss account as incurred.

The company does not have a policy of allowing the encashment of leave to its staff and employees.

The Company has a defined benefit plan for providing for Gratuity payable to its employees in form of contribution to the Group Gratuity Scheme of the Life Insurance Corporation of India. The above mentioned scheme is classified as defined contribution plan as the company has no further obligation beyond making the contributions. The contributions to the Scheme are charged to the Profit and Loss Account as incurred. The company's policy of providing Gratuity is in line with the provisions of The Payment of Gratuity Act. As a measure of prudence, any shortfall in the Fair value of assets of the fund and the liability as at the valuation date is provided as a charge (net of income tax) to the profits of each period.

10. Impairment of Assets

An asset is treated as impaired when the carrying cost of asset exceeds its recoverable value. An impairment loss is charged to the Profit and Loss Account in the year in which an asset is identified as impaired. The impairment loss recognized in prior accounting period is reversed if there has been a change in the estimate of recoverable amount.

11. Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs that are attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalized as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use. All other borrowing costs are charged to Profit and Loss account.

12. Employee benefit Plans

a)	Defined Contribution plans: The Company has Defined Contribution plans for post employment benefits namely Provident Fund and Pension Scheme The Company contributes to a Government administered Provident Fund and Pension Scheme and has no further obligation beyond making its contribution. The
	Company's contribution to the above funds is charged to revenue every year.
b)	Defined Benefit Plans: The Company has a defined Gratuity plan for the gratuity payable to employees on death or retirement.
